

Attached to this newsletter is our Home Learning Guidelines document. We are not a school that sends home worksheets for homework. We believe home learning should be authentic and enjoyable for our learners. There is no research that indicates that homework in the primary years of school makes a difference to learning outcomes for children. We believe in reading each evening, practising spelling, and learning number fact games. We also believe children should be allowed to be children and that they should spend their out of school hours playing outside and exploring new pursuits such as team sports, judo, learning an instrument, dance etc. If you are wanting your child to be involved in skill and drill repetition activities, there are many websites you can access. But please, do not turn your child off learning. We want to foster their curiosity and desire to grow.

REMINDERS

School Parking

We ask that families work with each other to provide a safe place for drop off and pick up for our KPS families. We do not want a bad name in the community.

School gates open at 8:45am so being early helps. Children can be left in the yard to play before school from this time as they are supervised. Neighbourhood doors open from 8:50am for soft start.

Please do not:

- Park in the disabled car parks unless you have a permit
- Park in the 2 driveways at the front of the school
- Use the staff carparks
- Drop children off while you are stopped at the crossing
- Double park
- Cross the double lines when changing direction, please use the roundabouts at either end of the school grounds.

We are very lucky and have a beautiful parkland across the road from the school which you can park your car around and then access the crossing.

Families can also access the school via the gates in Ventura Way. There is plenty of parking in this street.

Traffic inspectors will be patrolling over the coming days; they will be fining people who break any of the road laws.

attendance

We ran this info page late last year, but as we enter a new year, it is always good to revisit the importance of attendance.

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school - each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.



what can we do?

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness - There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

"Day off" - Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates - every day counts.

Truancy - This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If your child is absent for any reason, <u>please communicate this through Compass or discuss with your child's mentor teacher.</u>

getting in early...
Attendance patterns are established

early - a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day - even in the early years of primary school.
