# A MESSAGE FROM MISS LOREN

14th July, 2023

Dear KPS families.

Welcome back to Term 3, we hope everyone had a great break and is now back into the routines of school days. It has been lovely catching up with our students as they shared their holiday news.

Our dance classes started yesterday; the children who attended had a fantastic time. We are looking forward to upcoming sessions as our students build up their dancing skills and routines.

Term 3 has many activities planned and we ask that families make sure they are keeping up with Compass posts, payments etc. I would encourage all families to set a time to read the newsletter, explore the Compass portal and update calendars so you are prepared. As our school grows, we are unable to chase families for permissions, payments etc. Please involve your children in filling in calendars and making reminders so they learn to organise their own lives as the grow up.

As mentioned in a Compass post on Wednesday, we are averaging 7% of students late each morning for the first 3 days of the term. This equates to 2 children every day in each class missing the start of the school day. Some students are arriving up to 12 mins after the 9 am bell. Being late impacts your child's time to be orientated to their day, connect with peers and staff and be ready to learn. Late students also take up important staff time as we support the children to get into class. This is not a great start to the term, so we



In Visual Arts, year 2/3s collaborated to create a night sky using charcoal.




It was wonderful to see students working together and being engrossed in a project which honoured the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander as the very first Astronomers.





NAIDOC week class projects by Prep and Year 1



















First Quadrant Coordinates from Year 456
