
Dear KPS families,

Parent Opinion Survey

The Department of Education 'Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey' is an annual survey that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. At KPS, all families are invited to participate in the survey. The survey will be conducted online, it only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

Payments for excursions, incursions and camps

When organising events that involve costs, such as excursions, incursions and camps, our school needs to meet the requirements of the venues in relation to final numbers and invoice payments. To ensure the school can meet these requirements, we set a payment cut-off date that is included on the permission

note. Once this date passes, we confirm final numbers with venues/service providers and organise payment to them. Late payments cannot be accepted, as the venue, provider and school close off the systems based on payments received and confirmed attendance numbers. All notes with payment due dates are sent out via Compass.

Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school.

The Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents/carers s of students, who do not have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs. Parents/carers can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers. The Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.


