Bullying is not when someone is mean once or twice.

**Bullying definition** Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying. # SCIENCEWEEK NET AU 12-20 AUGUST 2023

Last week was National Science Week. National Science Week started in 1997, it is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology. Each year, events highlight the importance of these fields and the impact they have on the world in which we all live. The school theme for National Science Week in 2023 was Innovation: Powering Future Industries.

In STEM students learned that when people are innovative, they find better ways of doing things like applying ideas to improve a product or service. Innovative people work creatively to solve complex problems.

Students looked at innovations in photography, they were very surprised to hear that "in the olden days" you would have to wait for 2 weeks to get your photographs developed. Some innovations in photography have been 1 hour film developing and the move to digital photographs.

We then looked at toy trains and how they have changed in 50 years. Some innovations we saw were using magnets to connect the engine to the carriage, battery operated trains and colour snaps to code trains. All students used their coding skills to guide the Intelino Coding trains.


