

TALES FROM TEACHING & LEARNING

Reading at KPS

Yesterday there was wide media coverage of the announcement made by the Minster for Education, The Hon. Ben Carroll, regarding how reading is to be taught in Victorian Government primary schools from 2025. If you have attended an information session at KPS you will have heard us talking about 'Learning to Read' and 'Reading to Learn'. The practices we currently have in place at KPS are already fully aligned with the new requirements announced.

What is Learning to Read?

Learning to Read is where we explicitly teach phonics and phonemic awareness with a predominant focus on this in the Early Years with our Prep to Year 2 students. As our students master the skills related to phonics (recognising sounds, blending sounds and decoding words) and build their reading fluency, the emphasis on their independent reading then shifts to comprehending texts and exploring different types of texts, features of texts and varying levels of comprehension. This does not mean that we do not look at rich, authentic texts before the students can independently and fluently read. We do read these texts with the students, but we do not expect the students to be reading them themselves, the teacher is the expert reader. This is the Reading to Learn element of our curriculum and is explained below.

When a child is learning to read, they are putting all their effort and attention towards recognising the sounds, blending sounds and reading words and phrases. This is where 'decodable texts' come into play to provide texts which contain sounds the student has mastered. Our school has access to the <u>Decodable Readers Australia</u> website and each child in the Early Years has an individual log in so that they can read these books at school, and at home.

What is Reading to Learn?

As mentioned above, we do not wait until a child can independently read before we start 'reading to learn'. The role of the student and teacher in this phase of learning differs depending upon the student's level of decoding mastery. For our younger students our teachers read the text to them, showing them text directionality, text and literary features and most importantly, helping them understand and make meaning of the text. Our *Reading to Learn* texts are linked to the learning focus of the term, eg. this term texts have been linked to the history focus. Each week we also have a Rich Literature focus where students explore a fiction text such as a picture story book, fable or class novel. This approach builds their understanding of the topic we are learning about and explicitly teaches them strategies to understand the text such as summarising the story or information, comparing information, discussing characters in a story etc.

How can you help at home?

Supporting your child with reading at home and modelling a love of reading plays an integral part in their development. Providing time for your child to read their take home book or enjoy a library book with you each night gives them an opportunity to build their confidence and reinforce the skills we are learning at school.

What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition, open to students in Year 2 to Year 6, that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

- Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development.
- Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report.
- Top performers will be eligible for medals.

How do I register my child?

If you wish for your child to participate in ICAS this year, please:

- 2. Enter our school's access code SOE308
- 3. Enter your child's details
- 4. Select the tests you would like to purchase, then proceed to payment.

After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

The final date to sign your child up for ICAS is Monday 29th July.

What will we do?

We will notify you of the date(s) that we run ICAS at Keelonith and when your child's ICAS results are ready. You and your child can access the results once released via the Reports Portal using the TAP ID and pin found on the back of the ICAS certificate.

We are proud to offer ICAS and look forward to some fantastic results later in the year.




